

Rob's Ramblings

Hi everyone,

We had yet another fabulous competition evening, with the Set Subject being Patterns and Shapes. Members produced some delightful ideas and beautiful photos.

One thing that came out of the evening was that our judge had a thing about borders on images - and rightly so in my opinion. As a matter of interest, I make the adding of a border part of my standard image processing workflow. Once I have finished editing, I save the workings as a TIF file, then flatten the layers, resize the image and change it to 8-bit, and then add the border and save the JPG file. My border seldom changes, and as I often have black as a background, I try to make the border as inconspicuous as possible, just enough to show where the photo starts and ends. My standard settings for the border are:

1 pixel White 50% opacity

These final settings changes are all recorded as actions in Photoshop, so two clicks after I have saved the TIF file, the image is ready for submission. If anyone here is new to Photoshop and would like help on this, please send me an email and I will help. Actions are one of the great time-savers in PS.

I'm very excited for my long-standing colleague, Frans du Bois, who after the Golds he received at the May competition, deservedly has reached Master status! What a fantastic achievement. Frans has been a loyal and supportive member since 2013. Keep those beauties coming, Frans - especially more like that regal lioness!

Further on in The Bellows is an article of some changes to our House Rules. They are important, so please make sure you have a read through them.

The newsletter ends off this month with some more images from members that have done extra well in salons.

May Competition:

Our trend continues - there was a larger number of entries in the Set Subject category, compared to in the Open category.

- 42 images were entered in the Set Subject category. The winning score was 30! with the average score being 23.9 and 20 being the most common score. A full list of the Set Subject scores can be found by clicking *here*.
- 31 images were entered in the Open category. The winning score was 29, with the average score being 23.6, and 24 being the most common score. A full list of the Open scores can be found by clicking *here*

Changes to our **House Rules**

At the May competition, we had an unfortunate incident where one of John Read's images was initially disqualified as being too similar to an image submitted previously. The original image submitted the previous month was correctly disqualified as John had included his logo on the image.

John appealed the second disqualification, and the committee found that they had been incorrectly following the PSSA salon guidelines, which state that "images that are too similar may not be accepted in competitions". However, as this rule was not specifically stated in our House Rules, John was actually entitled to submit the second image. The disqualification was therefore reversed, and John was accordingly awarded the score decided by the judge (25) and awarded Gold status for the image. The committee apologies to John for the misunderstanding and inconvenience. These are the two images in question:

Moving forward, as it is part of the standard rules and guidelines for PSSA salons, and to maintain consistency with other affiliated clubs, we have decided to amend our House Rules to incorporate the same guidelines as per the PSSA website. The following amendments have been made to section 3.2 of the rules and are effective immediately:

- 3.2. ENTRIES: The following evaluation criteria only applies to images submitted to our monthly competitions. Once the image has been entered and judged, you are free to manipulate the image according to the judge's and other members' critique, and submit the manipulated image at another club's competition or salons. Digital and print entries for each month's competition shall be uploaded in the prescribed fashion and time onto an Internet website recommended and approved by the committee.
- Images shall be correctly downsized. (see 3.6)
- Naming of Images: Images submitted need to be notably different from previous submissions. Each image must have a unique name, i.e. the name of the image may not be changed. What this means is that even if you convert the image from colour to mono, or from digital to print, it must always have the same title. You can't add anything to that title to indicate that it is version 2, or BW or print etc. For example, an image, entered in month 1 of a competition, which is then converted to mono or print, must retain its original title and may not be re-entered into future competitions.
- Same or similar images: Similar implies that it is almost the same time, or almost the same place, or almost the same situation. Just another frame in an action series, or a different crop is not necessarily sufficiently different to make it a different image by being almost the same it is a similar shot. This is true in any genre, be it portrait, landscape, creative, nature etc.

As an example, any image which is sufficiently similar to another, such as the two images below, may be ruled ineligible as being effectively the same image:

Looking back at all the images that were submitted for club competitions over past months, it has been noted that there are a number of images that would be disqualified under the amended rules. Obviously nothing will be done about those images now.

Ed's note:

Yours truly has also been a culprit! And I should have known better, but quite honestly, I had forgotten about the first image when I posted the second! The two images were submitted, first one in a Set Subject Mono category in September last year, the second in the Open category in January this year. I can only blame my age and failing memory for the oversight, but nevertheless, if it happened again, the second image would be disqualified. These are the two versions of my image: So I've given myself a stern talking-to and it shouldn't





happen again!


