In addition, there will be rolling audio visual displays in different parts of the Art School, from all participating clubs, with each club showcasing 20 digital images.

Our Annual Awards evening will be on Saturday 30th November at the Royal Cape Yacht Club. Ticket prices are R350 per person, which includes a 3 course meal and coffee, drinks are for your own account. Places are limited to 30, and tickets will go on sale early in November.

Our outing for October was to Spier, and was attended by quite a few members, as well as some visitors. Had a great time walking around and taking photos.

Another 12 months have passed us by.

Our club competition evenings, here at the NG Kerk in Panorama, have been hugely successful, especially with a hybrid system in place. It does have its challenges, with the odd battery going flat or cable not connected, but overall, I think hugely successful in bringing our members together.

We have been very fortunate in making sure we have the funds available to ensure we continue to meet the needs of our members, especially to those who live in the area as well as those outside our area or due to various circumstances cannot attend in person. We have had on average about half of our members (average about 23) join us, either in person or via Zoom on most of our club competition nights.

Competitions:

PPSA Interclub - TPS continues to enter the PSSA annual Interclub, with both Junior and Senior entries. We have not been as successful in previous years, but as David said, the wheel turns, and we have moved off the top and will return to the top.

The Celebration of Photography, in its second year, is being hosted by Paarl this year. The celebration replaced the WCPF Interclub competition, where the aim now is to showcase all photographers, with the emphasis on our juniors, rather than just the best photographers from each club. In this way, a selection of our junior and senior members' images are printed and put on display. We have submitted 10 prints (5 junior and 5 senior) and 20 digital images for the AV display.

Education & outings:

Our L&S evenings have been most worthwhile this year, with us being able to secure good strong presenters on various genres throughout the year. Our plan is to continue with this process next year. While we have had fewer outings this year, they have all been well attended, and we have been fortunate that other clubs have joined in with us. The main struggle is coming up with ideas on where to go, to satisfy the needs of you, our members. Please consider giving us some ideas to consider for future outings.

To my support team:

Once again, this past year has seen huge commitment from your committee members, myself, David and Francois. I would, however, like to single out 3 special members, who noticed the struggles the 3 of us had and coopted themselves onto the committee to assist us.

Rob Minter stepped up and took over the publishing of our monthly magazine, The Bellows. A huge amount of work goes into the preparation and final publishing of this magazine.

Marleen La Grange stepped in, and took over ensuring we had some tea, coffee and something nice to eat, at our monthly meetings.

Martin Kleingeld, who continued to assimilate the entries each month, managing the process to ensure

we ended up with a final small batch of images from all the entries over the 12 months, for final adjudication for PSSA entry – 15 juniors and 15 seniors. Whittled down from over 1, 000 entries to just 30 entries.

A huge vote of thanks each one of you, Rob, Marleen and Martin - Thank you.

To two other very hard working committee members:-

David Barnes, what would we have done without you? Your ongoing commitment to TPS, from making sure our website is up to date (who knows David had no idea how to update and maintain a webpage, and he has done a sterling job), to ensuring we have a competent judge every month, ensuring the images are downloaded and sent to the judge in time to be able to review and score them, and then finally, to managing the entire setup we see here tonight, the full hybrid system, allowing members to join us via Zoom, as well as catering for those present here in person, and of course, our judge. (with Zoom, we are able to source competent judges from anywhere in South Africa, not just the Western Cape). It does not end there, David then updates our website and Facebook pages with the top images.

Francois du Bois, who has been the bedrock in ensuring we remain focused on what has made TPS great. To securing this venue, making sure it is ready for our monthly club competitions and to guiding me in many areas, be it with matters involving the WCPF or TPS, thus ensuring we remain focused. Always coming up with good suggestions for outings, going out and reccing them to see if they are suitable, and then attending them and our L&S evenings.

In conclusion:

This year has seen quite a few new members join TPS, in fact 13 new members, which include 2 scholars. Our member ship now stands at 48.

We have 2 international members residing in Hebden Bridge in the UK, and quite a few members who live outside of our venue area, from Dortrecht in the Eastern Cape, Mossel Bay through to Fraanskraal

and Somerset West.

This month's set subject

ICM (INTENTIONAL CAMERA MOVEMENT)

Definition

ICM is a photographic technique where you move the camera as the image is being taken. One example of this is panning. ICM can also be presented as an abstract type of image where nothing is intentionally sharp

Ed's note: ICM is a technique that is becoming more and more popular. However, it's not a simple art, and involves a lot more thought than just moving the camera while you are taking a shot. For anyone who is interested in the topic, I would highly recommend spending approximately an hour watching a video by one of the masters of the technique.

It's called "The art of ICM and creative photography". It's presented by Charlotte Bentley, and you can find it <u>here</u>.

PSSA Honours changes to note (26/10/2024)

PSSA members may apply for Panel Honours (LPSSA, APSSA, FPSSA etc.) or Salon Honours (DPSSA, EPSSA etc.) without being nominated. Next year there will be some changes to these Honours that prospective applicants should take note of.

Changes to Panel Honours

- Next year, the deadline for the submission of panels for the second Honours judging session will be brought forward to 25th May. This is so that the panel can meet in June and certificates of the successful candidates can be prepared in time to be handed out at the Honours Banquet at the 2025 PSSA National Struisbaai Congress on 15 August. Traditionally the Honours Judging Panel meet mid-July to determine if the approximately 100 submitted panels meet the standard required of the honour awarded at that level.
- The conversion of three LPSSA awards to APSSA will be discontinued. It will in future be indicated as LPSSA(Vers).

The next deadline for submissions of Panel Honours is 25 January 2025.

Changes to Salon Honours

- Applicants will no longer have to apply (and pay) for DPSSA(Vers), which will be automatically awarded to a member who receives three DPSSAs. Only the metal badge will be charged for, if required.
- DPSSA and EPSSA awards will now be published on the website twice a year when panel honours are published. Recipients will, however, be informed when these Honours are awarded and may use it immediately.

Changes due to costs

The awarding of Honours is a costly procedure, which is not covered by the fee paid by applicants. For example, the 12 judges of the panels must be accommodated for three days (judging starts on a Friday afternoon, continues throughout Saturday and ends on Sunday). In addition, the certificates, badges, print costs of the Honours Image, courier of the magazine, etc. contribute significantly to the costs borne by PSSA.

The Board therefore decided that Honours holders who wish to receive the metal badges will have to pay for these separately. All Honours holders will receive a digital badge, which they may use where appropriate.

The annual printed Honours Image magazine will only be made available free of charge to that year's Honours recipients. Recipients (and other members) will be offered the option of paying for additional printed magazines, which must be pre-ordered before printing. It will be available in digital format for all other members.

Good and bad WC news in PSSA annual competitions (23/10/2024)

Sadly, WC clubs did not do too well in the PSSA Interclub competition in which 31 clubs entered images from Senior members and 32 clubs entered work from Junior members.

Clubs were invited to enter up to 15 images from junior and 15 from senior club members.

Overall (Senior and Junior combined) CTPS, placed #10, fared the best of the WC clubs who entered the Interclub competition:

10th Cape Town Photographic Society - 1353 points

15th Hermanus Photographic Society - 1328 points

18th Tafelberg Fotografieklub - 1321 points

28th Tygerberg Photographic Society - 1270 points

32nd Witzenberg Photographic Society - 623 points (they only entered juniors
