Sponsors (ORMS and Cameraworld) made sponsor awards to both the grade 12 entrants and the forum prints.

John Read's image, Unfinished Symphony, was selected by the sponsors to be the best junior image on display.

Starting early in early 2025, she has two ICM courses which still have spaces - full details and other info at the link above for her online courses:

ICM - Deep Dive Six Subjects Course - Six Sessions

Course Dates in 2025: January 30, February 13 & 22, March 13 & 27, and April 10.

Over six sessions, she will guide you deep into 6 ICM subjects. Each week, a new presentation with loads of material from real shoots to fully understand all the aspects and factors that influence ICM photography, from 6 subjects – woodlands and trees, water, architecture and urban, animals, and the last week will cover several smaller subjects (so actually you get more than six subjects!)

In addition to the presentation each session, you will be asked to submit a homework assignment in response to each presentation. From this, you will gain timely and valuable individual feedback and an opportunity to discuss any challenges you found or questions that you have.

By the end of the course, you will have a deeper understanding of a variation of ICM subjects – some you may wish to take further, others you may not. However, having the support to experiment and gain immediate feedback is an invaluable way to learn and be supported if this interests you.

ICM - Deep Dive Six Concepts Course - Six Sessions

This course is six sessions run over a 3-month period. Sessions are two weeks apart. This allows adequate time for homework assignments to be completed and lots of time for experimentation and development of understanding.

TABLE TOP

Definition

Table top photography is one example of still life photography. It is a genre of photography used for the depiction of inanimate subject matter, typically a small group of objects. This gives the photographer more leeway in the arrangement of design elements within a composition, compared to other photographic genres, such as landscapes or portraits photography. The photographer has total control over the elements. Lighting and framing are important aspects of still life photography composition.

WCPF honours Phillip for his Youth work

PSSA Youth Director Phillip de Lange was awarded the *Golden Apple for Service to Photography* in the Western Cape at the recent *Celebration of Photography* event organised by the Western Cape Photographic Forum (WCPF). He earned this award for his service in promoting photography among the Youth.

WCPF honours Phillip for his Youth work (cont.)

The Golden Apple is a trophy designed by the daughter of former PSSA President (1973-75) Roy Johannesson to commemorate his 50-year membership of Cape Town Photographic Society (CTPS) in 2001. A former CTPS President, Roy decided to award the beautiful trophy to the member of his two Western Cape clubs, CTPS and Bellville (now Tygerberg), who provided exceptional service to photography during the year. After being awarded as a service honour for several years, a hiatus followed, until the Golden Apple was re-introduced as a service award by the WCPF in 2019.

In his motivation for Phillip receiving the award, PSSA Western Cape Regional Director Nicol du Toit said: "For quite a few years now Phillip has been doing a lot of work to encourage school children in the Western Cape to develop an interest in photography. He helped them and their clubs to register on PhotoVaultOnline, organised workshops and outings for them and helped them to develop their own photography by guiding and teaching them about photography and post processing. Many of the scholars joined adult clubs and have been achieving excellent results when participating in PSSA and international salons.

"It was clear to everybody that Phillip's passion was to help the youth," says Nicol. "Two years ago, he was elected to the PSSA Board of Directors and was assigned to the youth portfolio – first as committee member and recently as chair. It was not long before his influence spread to the rest of the country. Participation in youth salons increased manyfold, not only in national salons but also internationally. Often, the PSSA entry received the most acceptances. Phillip also encouraged many scholars to work towards gaining Diamond Ratings for salon acceptances, many from the Western Cape.

"The impact of this youthful photographic interest should not be underestimated as it ensures the future of photography at club level."
